

COMPLIANCE TO EU DIRECTIVES

This appliance conforms to the directives 2014/35/EU, EMC 2014/30/EU, 2011/65/EU and to the regulations (EC) No. 1935/2004 of 27/10/2004 regarding material in contact with foods. To dispose of the product correctly according to European Directive 2012/19/EU, please refer to and read the provided information enclosed with the product.



Danger for children

- Appliances can be used by persons with reduced physical, sensory 1. or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and if they understand the hazards involved.
- This appliance shall not be used by children. Keep the appliance and its 2. cord out of reach of children. Children shall not play with the appliance.
- 3. Never allow the cord to dangle in places where it may be grabbed by a child.
- 4. When disposing of the appliance as waste, it must be made inoperative by cutting off the power cord. Also remember to make any potentially hazardous parts of the appliance safe including the power cord, as

there is a risk that children may use them as playthings.

5. Packaging elements must not be left in reach of children as they are potentially hazardous.



Danger from electricity

- Make sure that the voltage on the appliance rating plate corresponds 6. to that of your local mains electricity supply.
- Never leave the appliance unattended when connected to the power 7. supply; unplug it after every use.
- Make sure that the power cord does not come into contact with hot 8. or sharp surfaces.
- 9. It is not recommended to use this appliance in conjunction with an extension cord.



Danger from other causes

- 10. Always unplug the power cord from the mains supply before fitting or removing attachments or before cleaning the appliance.
- 11. Always make sure that your hands are thoroughly dry before using or adjusting the controls on the appliance, or before touching the power plug or power connections.
- 12. Toasted bread can burn; never use the toaster under or alongside flammable materials, such as curtains.
- 13. Always handle the appliance with care during use and never touch the hot sides. Danger of burns.
- 14. Do not place plates or other items on top of the toaster during use.
- 15. Do not place more than one slice of bread in each slot.
- 16. Never insert forks or other utensils inside the toaster to remove the toast; this could damage the heating elements inside the appliance.
- 17. Never place your hands or any other metal materials (for example, knives or tin foil) inside the toaster. Risk of electrocution.
- 18. Use the appliance well away from flammable liquids; do not rest it against walls, curtains or plastic parts that are not heat resistant.

19. The appliance may only be wiped clean with a damp cloth and only after unplugging it from the mains and leaving it to cool completely.

- 20. After use, wait for the appliance to cool completely before storing.
- 21. This appliance may not be operated using external timers or remote controls.



Important, Possible damage to materials

- 22. Never place the appliance on or close to sources of heat.
- 23. Always place the appliance on a flat, level and heat resistant surface during use.
- 24. Never leave the appliance exposed to the elements (rain, sun, etc....).
- 25. Never immerse the appliance body, plug or power cord in water or other liquids; always wipe clean with a damp cloth only.
- 26. To unplug the appliance, grip the plug and remove it directly from the power socket. Never pull the power cord to unplug the appliance.
- 27. Do not use the appliance if the power cord or plug are damaged or if the appliance itself is faulty; all repairs, including the replacement of the power cord, must be carried out exclusively by the After Sales Support centre or by authorised technicians in order to avoid all risks.
- 28. Do not affect the safety of the appliance by using parts that are not original or which have not been approved by the manufacturer. Risk of electrocution or injury.
- 29. Any changes to this product that have not been expressly authorised by the manufacturer may lead to the user's warranty being rendered null and void.

OPERATION PRECAUTIONS

- Do not use slices of bread that are too thin or broken.
- Do not insert foods that could drip during cooking. As well as making cleaning more difficult, these foods can also become the cause of fire. It is also very important to clean any food residues or crumbs from the crumb tray (F) before each use.
- Do not insert food products that are too large by forcing them in.



Do not put forks or other utensils inside the toaster to remove the bread since they could damage the heating elements of the appliance. RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCKS.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

- Keep the appliance on for a few minutes the first time it is used so as to get rid of the "new" odour and any residual fumes from the manufacturing process.
- Keep the original packing for future use if it should prove necessary. It is the best way to
 properly protect it from being damaged during transportation.
 Before using this product, be sure to carefully follow the instructions supplied in this
 instruction manual carefully.

Preparing toast



Always allow at least 1 minute's cooling time between cycles if the toaster is being used more than once at a time.

- Connect your toaster to a suitable positioned wall socket and switch on.
- Put the slices of bread into the bread slots of the toaster and lower the ON lever (A) until it locks into place.
- Adjust the toasting level with the knob (B). Wait a few minutes and after the toast is automatically ejected, check its toasting level. If the toast is not browned enough, select a higher toasting level. If, on the other hand, it is too dark, select a lower level.
- Press the button (E) at any time to stop the toasting process.
- Press the button (E) to turn the appliance off and disconnect the plug from the socketoutlet.





Note: if the appliance is not plugged in, the lever does not lock.

Defrosting function

You can defrost frozen slices of bread by pressing the button (E) right after you lower the lever (A) and by setting the browning control knob (B) onto 1. If you wish to cook, rather than just defrosting, the knob will have to be set onto darker settings (i.e. 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7). The light integrated in the button will stay on as long as the defrosting function is used.

Heating function

Lower the on lever (A) and press the heating button (D). The light integrated in the button will stay on as long as this function is used. Please note that the heating time is fixed and cannot be changed.

CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

CAUTION

It is forbidden to disassemble the appliance or to try in any way to undertake any maintenance work on the appliance other than as described in this manual.

ATTENTION

Keeping the appliance clean and tidy will ensure you will get optimum toasting and a longer useful lifetime for your appliance.

- Turn off the appliance by pressing the button (C) and remove the plug from the socketoutlet before you start to clean it.
- Wait for the appliance to cool down before cleaning.
- Use only a slightly dampened cloth.
- Do not immerse the appliance in water or other liquids.
- Always dry the appliance parts by hand without putting them in an oven or microwave.
- Never use sharp metal utensils for cleaning the interior of the appliance.
- Unplug the appliance and empty the crumb tray (F) after each use.
- From time to time clean the exterior of the appliance with a damp cloth and then dry. Do not use abrasive detergents since they could damage the cosmetic surfaces of the appliance.
